June 10 - 12, 2022

This event is a time trial on the Okemo Mountain Road, on premises graciously provided by the State of Vermont, the Okemo Mountain resort, and the Town of Ludlow, VT.

The hillclimb will run according to the 2022 New England Hillclimb Series Regulations, Classifications, and Technical and Safety Requirements, as interpreted by the chairpersons. We must also comply with the terms of the Club's Special Use Permit from the state, State Park Stipulations for Time Trials, and our agreements with Okemo and the Town of Ludlow. Speedway Safety provides our professional rescue service

NOTE: mandatory ROOKIE instruction - if you have not run THIS HILL before, you must attend rookie instruction on Friday evening. See the Schedule for details. You will not need your car for this instruction session.

Paul Malko will be your event chair. Entries may be mailed to the Registrar: Michele Baumann, 48 Powerhouse Road, Moodus, CT 06469. Checks should be made payable to KSCC.

All workers get a close-up view unrivalled in motorsport, plus lunch and "liquid refreshments" at the close of the hill. Remember, the more workers you bring, the smoother things go and the more runs you get (hint, hint)

The field is limited to the first 55 paid entries. One entry is required for each driver. If a driver has more than one car to run, then each car needs an entry.

At this event, our goal is to use the time allotted to us by the state permit (8 AM to 5PM) to the maximum extent possible, and minimize waiting time. Our schedule to chieve this includes **earlier** scheduling of workers and driver's meetings, and a shorter lunch turnaround.

This is a muffled event, 96 dbA or less at 50 feet is considered muffled!

Each car and equipment must pass Technical Inspection before being allowed running in this event. Each driver must attend a drivers meeting each day before they are allowed to make familiarization, practice, and competition runs.

Although we hope for a fine summer day, Hillclimbs are run in all kinds of weather. Consideration will be given to worker safety, visibility, road condition and communications.

Note: Fluid spills are the responsibility of those who spill it. This includes cleanup and disposal, off premises. Each car must carry a large, heavy duty, trash bag. (This will be checked at tech inspection.) Oil absorbing materials are at the top and bottom of the hill.

And what is our reward for footin' the bill as drivers? An absolutely beautiful road, to be driven at glorious speed, in the wildest car you can get here, with your friends (please bring some, workers are always needed) to watch the turns. The camaraderie and competition are just icing on the cake...

WHERE:	Okemo Mountain Ski Area, Ludlow, Vt. Entrance is just west of Ludlow center on Route 103.
WHEN:	Saturday/Sunday, June 10 – 12, 2022
HOW MUCH:	Entry fee is \$180 for club members, \$200 for rally car entries (This includes members of all three clubs). \$190 entry for all non-members , \$210 for rally car entry . Limit of 55 paid entries. Make checks payable to KSCC .

Feel free to grab a broom and head slowly up the hill (there will be two way traffic). 3 - 7 PM: Registration (at parking lot entrance) 4 PM - dark: Tech Inspection (in parking lot) 6:30 - 7:30 PM: Mandatory Rookie Instruction (after signs are put up) - if you have not run THIS HILL before, you must attend rookie instruction. Meet at registration area.
	SATURDAY & SUNDAY Our State Special Use Permit allows us to use the hill between 8am to 5pm. 6:15 - 7:15 AM: Tech Inspection (Saturday Only) 6:15 - 7:00 AM: Registration 7:00 AM: Worker meeting (near registration) 7:15 AM: Mandatory driver meeting (in parking lot, listen for air horn) 7:45 AM: Workers to the hill 8:00 AM: First fam run then practice on Saturday, race on Sunday Sequence will be: Group A fam run and bring-down followed by first timed run for Group A. Group B driver-workers swap with Group B driver-workers during the bring-down Group B driver-workers swap with Group A driver-workers during the bring-down.
	Groups alternate runs for the rest of the day. Late registrants will run with Group B on Saturday. Noon (approx.): Lunch. Workers will report to Registration to receive afternoon assignments. Lunch break time is approximately 40 minutes. 1:00 PM (approx.): Group A and B continue to alternate runs until close of the hill. 5:00 PM: Hill closed to time trials / Equipment pickup Awards will be presented after equipment/wire crews have completed teardown on Sunday.
